HEADS TOUCH 1/4, the BOYS you RUN SWING THRU and then the BOYS RUN again son The COUPLES CIRCULATE one time you know HALF TAG & SCOOTBACK, the BOYS RUN and go

SLIDE THRU and do an EIGHT CHAIN TWO SWING MY CORNER and PROMENADE 'em you do I'm wishing on a post card That you were here with me

ALTERNATE MIDDLE BREAK, and CLOSER:

SIDES FACE, GRAND SQUARE (or GRAND SLIDE)

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INTRODUCTION, BREAK & CLOSER:

WALK AROUND YOUR CORNER, SEE-SAW your pet Join hands and you CIRCLE TO THE LEFT MEN STAR RIGHT, ONCE AROUND you will go ALLEMANDE LEFT, GRAND RIGHT & LEFT

And it's raining on the rock I'll tell you it's a long way, meet original Partner You **PROMENADE** her home with you Like an Aborigine

FIGURE #1:

HEAD COUPLES SQUARE THRU four hands you go Meet your Corner make a **RIGHT HAND STAR**, 3 stars **HEADS STAR LEFT**, Boy in the lead, Girl follow him in Two stars in the middle, to the same Corner go **R&L THRU**

--- STAR THRU, PASS THRU CORNER LADY SWING and PROMENADE And I'm proud to travel this great land Like an Aborigine

FIGURE #2:

Just the SIDE COUPLES LEAD TO THE RIGHT CIRCLE SIX, SIDE MEN LET GO WITH A LEFT MAKE A LINE, go FORWARD UP, come on BACK Go RIGHT & LEFT THRU turn her like that

PASS THE OCEAN and then BOYS CIRCULATE SWING YOUR CORNER, PROMENADE the ring And I'm wishing on a post card That you were here with me

SIX COUPLE SETS

Six regular couples are arranged with four Head couples (as facing lines), and two Side couples, as they would be in a normal square.

If you intend calling to individual dancers (or "Odds & Evens"), the numbering of couples is started with the left hand Head couple having their backs to the Caller, then continued in a counter clockwise direction (as in a regular set). # 2 is to the right of #1, #3 is a Side couple, #4 is a Head, facing #2, #5 is a Head, facing #1, and #6 is the other Side couple. Odd couples are #1, #3 & #5, while evens are #2, #4 & #6.

You can use almost all of the Mainstream & Plus calls with this formation. However, there are a few basics which need minor modifications. Grand R & L for example requires an extra 2 hands. AND the great news for Callers is that the majority of your Singing Call routines will work with a Six-Couple-Set (some won't). You do however need to allow an extra 8 beats for a full Promenade.

These sets provide excellent variety for your Dancers, and are very useful when you only have 6 couples, or if you have two sets, and some Dancers want to take a break. You don't need to teach anything new to get them started!

One of the instrumental tracks in this package has been edited to run 9 times through. This will allow you to call an "Intro", "Break" & "Closer", and 6 "Figures". I have also provided a Mainstream vocal for a Six Couple Set.

NOTE: You may like to check Brian's vocal for additional chorographical ideas.

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
